


KYC was NOT meant for SOCIAL DISTANCING it was meant for SOCIALIZING!! Better days ahead soon—WE HOPE!!!


Unfortunately our functions are still on hold due to Provincial COVID restrictions but I am optimistic that we may be able to have something later in the season.


**REAR COMMODORE—DALE PITCHER**

### HARD WORKING MEMBERS



#### You're a seasoned member at the Kanagio Yacht Club, or are you a new member hoping to quickly learn the

**ropes**. Everyone "*should know your club"*. **LET'S LOOK AROUND.** I am going to take you on a tour of the Yacht Club and show you some of the safety equipment installed throughout as well as some of the equipment that we as members have the pleasure of operating.

Every time you arrive at the club, you place your key fob on the activation pad and the gate automatically slides open, allowing you to drive into the parking lot and access the club facilities, the gate then closes. According to the KYC Rules the gate is to be closed at all times. WHAT HAPPENS IF THE HYDRO GOES OUT FOR AN EX-**TENDED PERIOD OF TIME?** The gate will not open if you drive up to it on the inside or if you try to enter using your key fob. If you must leave the property, you can do so by entering the private four digit number into the man gate and exit or enter the site on foot know this number. Guests arriving can push the button which will activate the club phone allowing a member to answer and inquire or open the gate. Do not lend out your FOB.





Now that you are on site, lets visit the grounds and have a look around at the facilities and safety equipment available should an emergency occur.



Lets hope you do not stumble and fall into the Kettle Creek off of the dock or your boats swim platform. If it should happen, look for the "YELLOW MARKER" on the seawall (shown in the photo), and there you will find a ladder to aid you in getting out of the water and back on dry land.

If you are on shore and someone should fall in the water, the light standards located along the dock area contain a life ring which can be tossed to the person in the water while arrangements are made for their retrieval or they can make their way to the ladders as shown above.





The standard hydro service provided to each dock consists of a 30 AMP service plugs for your boat, with each site also having one 15 AMP plug for each dock member.

The 30 amp plugs have a breaker located in the secondary panel, check where your dock breaker is located in the event of an overload and tripping of the breaker switch. The 15 amp has a GFI and will require re-setting should it trip. Please confirm that you are using the proper cords and that they are in good overall condition. Electrical shock should be avoided at all times.



Located on various light poles is a telephone which can be used for receiving and making telephone calls. This station is also connected to the gate pad and can be used to acknowledge guests and open the gate by pressing #11. A life ring and fire extinguisher are also available in case of emergency. Water service is also provided. The lights come on automatically with a light sensor at dusk.






Located off the parking lot is the main electrical building. A fire extinguisher can also be found on the left side of the door.



Located inside the club house on the north wall adjacent to the fireplace and identified by a sign is a **Defibulator**—know its location just incase you ever have to use it.












There are four EXIT points from the club house meeting hall. On the east end exiting to the patio, the south wall exiting past the washroom to the patio and on the west side to the parking lot and through the kitchen. There is also a fire extinguisher located on the east wall.





Located on the east wall of the kitchen are two fire extinguishers and a first aid kit.





Located in the hall between the Kitchen and the main hall is the **NOTICE BULLETIN BOARD**.

The board will provide you with information on member names and contact information, as well as their well assignment.

Additional information on Club functions and items of interest will be posted on this board for your information. The sign-up sheet for gasoline is currently on this sheet.

The LIFT IN/OUT BOARD is located in the hall adjacent the mens washroom. It is also the location to list your name and dock number should you be travelling away from the club. Indicate date of departure and return to the club. Your dock may be used for arriving guests while you are away.





The "Honey Sucker" is one of those jobs we hate to do but is necessary. It is one of those membership little extras that can save you a lot of money over a season as most marina charge to pump your holding tank out.

In this case you have the equipment however, you must do the job yourself. It is actually an easy job, but please get instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.

PLEASE BE COURTEOUS WHEN USING THIS EQUIP-MENT, don't use it when your neighbours are eating, or entertaining guests



After pumping out your boat empty the tank before putting it away. The disposal area is located just south of the club house off the parking lot. A hose is provided if needed, it is attached to the club house by the air conditioning unit.





The "Well" is used by the Travel Lift to access your boat. The Well and Lift also dictate the maximum size of boat that a member can have at the club. The Well is 15 feet wide thus restricting boats to a beam width of approximately 14.5 feet wide.



When it comes to membership saving, few things save you more than the **TRAVEL LIFT**. Operated by a number of dedicated club members, the lift is available in the Spring to put your boat in the water for a summer of enjoyment and in the fall to bring it out for winter storage. Should you have a problem it is also available to lift it for service. Be sure to thank the operators and give them advance notice of the need for their service if possible.



The club has a gasoline powered high pressure washer for cleaning the bottom of your boat when it comes out of the water or for general cleaning purposes around the club. Treat it like it was your own. When it is tagged for winter storage, please don't use the machine, the club had to replace one unit.



The site is used for winter storage with members allocated a parking space for their boat and other equipment. All sites have access to hydro and water for charging batteries and cleaning your boat.





The "South Yard" provides storage during the summer months for member trailers and boat stands. Please don't lock your trailer it might have to be moved during the season.



A new addition to the club was the purchase of our own **BARGE** which allows the team members to install the docks in the spring and make repairs when necessary. This was a major Capital Expenditure of approximately \$100,000 by the club, but will be paid off quickly and provide independence to the club.





**Gasoline is available to members ONLY**. It is sold at a marginal profit to cover the cost of gas for the lift and tractors. The convenience of this item is another highlight of membership in KYC.

Available from a member of the Gas Committee on Saturdays and Wednesdays, please register in the club house for a time so that a member can be available and also so the Committee Chairman knows how much gas is going to be needed.

### WE HAVE TWO TRACTORS FOR HAULING THE "HONEY SUCKER" AND VARIOUS TRAILERS AROUND THE SITE.



This is the newest addition to the fleet and best for heavy lifting. Note—this unit is a **DIESEL-POWERED UNIT** please don't fill it up with gas. It is a good idea to have someone familiar with the operation of the tractor give you a quick overview of operating procedures.



The Green John Deere tractor is a **GAS POWERED UNIT**. It has been in service for many years and just keeps on going. Pull the choke out, turn the key and push the choke back in and move the leaver for forward or reverse action.

NEW MEMBERS MUST HAVE A FAMILIARIZATION WITH THE EQUIPMENT BEFORE USING IT FOR THE FIRST TIME.

EITHER THE REAR COMMODORE OR ANOTHER MEMBER WITH KNOWLEDGE CAN PROVIDE THIS INSTRUCTION.





Bagged ice is available adjacent to the south side of the club house as well as at the rear of the shelter at the south end of the club.

Don't forget to place \$2.50 in the coin box.



Not every club can say they have a g e n u i n e "JAPANESE YEW TREE" on site. Started many years ago and maintained by a former club member the tree is located on the west side of the club house.



wheel barrows are located along the member parking area for transportation of equipment and food between your car and boat. Do not use it for any other purpose, such as moving dirt. Please return when you are finished with it.

**INTERNET SERVICE** is considered a necessary item in these days and the club provides this service as part of your annual dues.





With our parklike setting, it is enhanced by a number of shade trees, and an attractive pond and fountain which greets members as they enter as well as guests to the property. A swing and play area is available next to the club house as well as a horse shoe pit.

**MEMBER PARKING** is provided close to the dock area. If you bring two cars please park behind each other to provide space for other members. Guest parking is also marked.







The deck area on the east side of the club house, is attractively landscaped with a variety of plants and is maintained by club members.



Located at the south end of the club grounds is the Pavilion shelter which also provides access to bags of ice and two fire extinguishers. As mentioned before, don't forget to put your \$2.50 in the change box.



If you change your boat engine oil, you can dispose of it in the south yard . Slide the top back and place it in the tank provided. It is removed by a third party.





Poles located along the parking lot provide 30 amp electrical service and water. This is for members fall and spring boat preparation.

Two "Johnny on the Spots" are provided at the east end of the parking lot.



Located in the garage are a non-coin operated washer and dryer for member use.





For member use and aiding in your "Work Hours Requirement" the club has a wide range of tools and equipment to make the job easier. Also available in the garage, adjacent the man-door are two fire extinguishers in case of emergency.


